### **UPDATE**

Time Warner responded by saying that the intentions were not to stop payment but to be informative. At this time, Greenville will continue to receive the franchise payments from Time Warner.

## **Budget**

On September 10<sup>th</sup>, the Town Board passed the budget for 2013. As some of you know, the Town is able to operate on a very small amount of money. Very little of the Town's income is provided by property taxes.

## **Growth**

The Town approved two (2) building permits last month. Mr. Don Thieneman requested to begin stage 2 of the Heritage Springs Subdivision. The Town Board approved Mr. Thieneman's request to start installing additional streets without posting bonds up front, but bonds must be put for the additional infrastructure once the roads are completed.

## **Roads**

Councilman Wright surveyed the roads around Town and identified a few areas that need some attention. The Town accepted the winning bid from Streigel Paving to complete the work. Also, a 3-way stop has been approved for the corner of Harrison Street and East 2<sup>nd</sup> Street. The purpose of the 3-way stop is to combat speeding which is putting citizens in danger.

## **Marshal's Department**

### **Activates:**

School started in August and we had three units out in the morning running radar on US 150, Voyles and Peking. Each unit reported issuing citations for speeding, warnings for speeding among other violation. Our other investigations are still continuing with a felony case in Clark County Court coming up next month. We were able to close an assault and battery case and a death investigation. The department is undergoing some intense training on the computer system used by the Floyd County Police Department. This is so we may input case reports on county calls. It is NOT a user friendly system. The training will take place one day each week for approximately two months.
